Goodstart Nirimba will feature eight spacious learning areas, nature-inspired indoor and outdoor play spaces, and an on-site chef preparing fresh meals daily. The centre will also be eligible for Child Care Subsidy (CCS) and the Queensland Government's 'Free Kindy' program, offering affordable and accessible options for local families.

Kerrin Thomas, Queensland State Manager for Goodstart Early Learning, said the new centre would deliver long-lasting benefits for Aura families by combining high-quality care with play-based learning approaches.

"At Goodstart, we believe every child deserves the best possible start in life, and we're committed to working closely with families to provide the ideal early learning environment, supporting each child to reach their full potential," Ms Thomas said.



"Our educational programs are designed to encourage creativity and exploration, inspiring an early love of learning. This centre will provide a nurturing, home-like environment with highly qualified educators who tailor programs to each child's interests and strengths, ensuring they're ready for the transition to formal schooling."

Goodstart Early Learning is Australia's largest early learning provider and also operates as a notfor-profit, with any surplus being reinvested into its centres, staff and children.
