Splash'n'Play Adventure Park

Amity Way, South Ripley



With its streams and jets of bubbling water, climbing adventures, and sun-safe sails, our Splash'n'Play waterpark and outdoor adventure playground is fun for everyone from toddlers to teens. Harmony Crescent, South Ripley



Located close to the dog park, this unique yoga circle is perfect for those who wish to unwind, stretch, breathe, and re-connect. Its large area is ideal for a solo session or weekly group meet-ups. Will you be seen on your mat at the yoga circle?

2. **Ironbark Park**
Freedom Crescent, South Ripley



Our first major sports ground, Ironbark Park, is equipped with a cricket pitch, goal posts, and lights. Ironbark Park is already open and home to Ripley Valley Football Club senior men's and women's, and junior teams.

3. **Treehouse Park**
Barrams Road, South Ripley



This treehouse-themed park features a large round swing suitable to fit multiple young users and a slide to encourage children to climb up and have fun sliding down. The shade sail at this toddler-friendly park means fun can be had all day long. Treehouse Park also has half courts and hoops for basketball and netball, offering a variety of activities for everyone.

5. **Mirrigin Park**
Danbulla Street, South Ripley



Named after the meaning of Stars in the local Yagarabul language, this park sits atop the highest point in the Providence community, offering the perfect vantage point for stargazing under the vast, open sky. Thoughtfully named and designed in collaboration with our Yuggera Ugarapul community, it features a yarning circle and totems that beautifully share the stories of our rich local heritage.

6. **Mine Memorial Park**
Danbulla Street, South Ripley



This park pays tribute to the 18 miners who lost their lives in the Box Flat explosion in 1972. To commemorate the 50th anniversary of this terrible incident, 18 box trees were planted in memory of the miners at the opening of this park.

8. **Rascals Park**
Wyperfeld Crescent

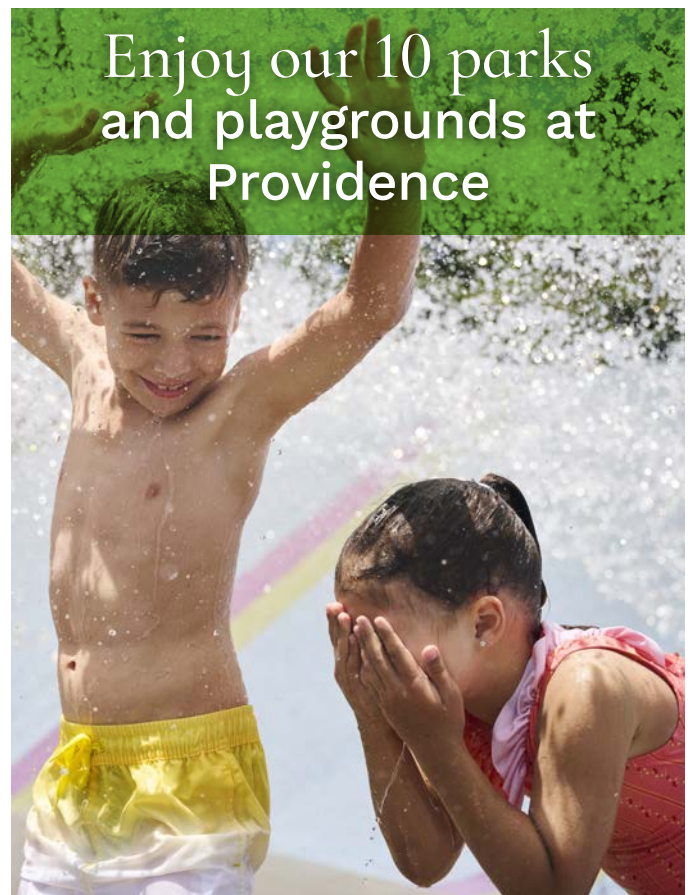


This nature play-theme park features a dry creek bed and sandstone steppers, and offers amazing views. Named by the community after the youngest Ripley Valley Basketball team, it contrasts with nearby adventure-themed parks. It includes two slides, a large multi-person swing, spiral tunnels, and leap-frog bumps, all designed for younger children. The park's picnic shelter is perfect for parent catch-ups.

10. **Providence Dog Park**
Harmony Crescent, South Ripley



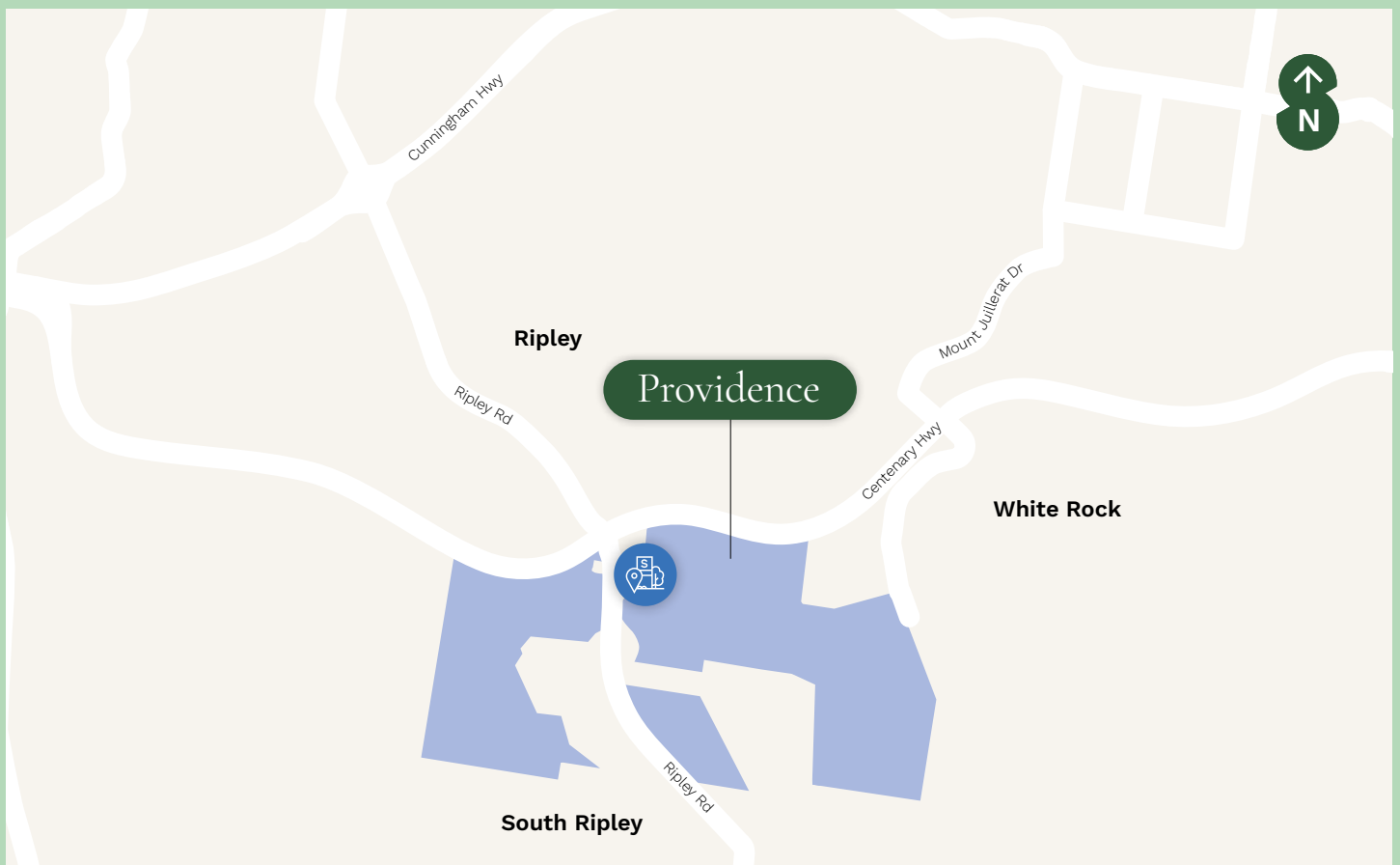
We celebrated our furry friends in 2019 with the opening of our first dog park. The off-leash areas cover about 2,500 square metres and have several new dog-friendly features. The off-leash dog areas are separated into two different spaces: one for small dogs and one for larger dogs and include canine agility equipment and sheltered areas.
